The Light of St. John's December, 2020

"But now, Lord, what do I look for? My hope is in you." Psalm 39:7

The circle of the advent wreath reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. The light of the flickering candle flames reminds us who Jesus is: "In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. John 1:4-5

1st Candle-Hope (Prophet's Candle)
2nd Candle-Faith (Bethlehem's Candle)
3rd Candle - Joy (Shepherd's Candle)
4th Candle-Peace (Angel's Candle)
5th Candle Light and Purity (Christ Candle)



Beginning December 1st, read one chapter of Luke each day through December 24th.
There are 24 chapters. By Christmas Eve, you will have read all 24 chapters – an entire account of the birth, ministry, sacrifice on the cross, and resurrection of Jesus
