The Light of St. John's June, 2020

"...I was given a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me. Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. But he said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.' Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake,

I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." 2 Corinthians 12:7-10

In Paul's letter to the Corinthians he explains how his life had been difficult through an affliction which he called "a thorn in the flesh." No one knows for certain what the affliction was. It could have been a physical ailment, or it could have been a difficult person that Paul had to deal with, or perhaps a difficult circumstance that God chose not to remove from Paul.

I believe that the reason we do not know for certain what the thorn was is because every person has thorns in their lives and they come in many forms, which may or may not be like Paul's thorn. This verse, therefore, applies to all of us. Paul prayed three times specifically asking God to remove it. But God chose not to give Paul his request; instead God chose to give him something greater, to teach him something more valuable—that His grace can meet us at the point of our deepest need.

True, there are times when God spectacularly removes the thorn—the cancer goes into remission and disappears, your health/finances/relationships take a remarkable turn for the better. Yet often God has something even greater for us—the ongoing lesson that His grace is sufficient to help us learn to live with our "thorn in the flesh." Paul's own explanation was that God was using the thorn to humble Paul and keep him a useful vessel for the Lord's work.

Even though God many times removes the thorns in our lives, He sometimes leaves the thorns so that we will continue to rely upon God. Understand that God cannot work in the life of a strong person, the person who is independent and has need of nothing even from God. Rather, God works in the life of the person who is spiritually broken. And sometimes God allows us to remain in brokenness and unfavorable circumstances so that we will turn to God as the source of our strength. In fact, God's power is at its strongest in our lives when we are at our weakest. That is probably why Jesus told his followers, "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth." Matthew 5:3-5

Our nation has been dealing with the reality of Covid-19 for nearly three months now. While I don't believe God ever causes disease, I believe that God uses times like this to help us to turn back to God. And with the thorns in our daily lives that God sometimes doesn't remove, we can find peace knowing that these are the times that God is really at work in our lives, blessing us because "when we are weak, then we are strong."




