

It's almost spring. And if I needed a reminder, I received one about two Sundays ago. I was driving to church early that Sunday morning on FM 111, when all of a sudden a flock of robins flew in front of my car. This is a familiar sight in late winter in Central Texas as robins make their annual migratory trip from Mexico to Canada. And on this day it wasn't just a small group of robins. It was literally thousands of birds flying over the road with some landing in a nearby pasture. I stopped my vehicle
