## The Light of St. John's October, 2020

"Does [God] not see my ways and number all my steps?" Job 31:4

Most people map out their route ahead of time when taking a trip to places never traveled. Of course today instead of a map we use GPS. With the touch of a button a sense of peace comes upon us as we know the exact route and even the length of time the trip will take. With GPS on a long trip, we have a sense that we are in control of the circumstances. However, planning for every possible scenario we might encounter while traveling is impossible.

Life is the same. We like to think we are in control, but life's circumstances have a way of throwing a curve ball at us and then we realize that we are never really in control. Only God is in control, and when we acknowledge him on a daily basis as our Lord, he numbers our steps and plans for all the unknowns that come our way. Life can be chaotic and, in order not to make sure we stay on the right path, we should rely on GPS. 
